New Training Course for Builders in Brighton - the Green Angle on Recent Revisions to the Building Regulations

Building Regulations are set to change as we head down the uncertain road to zero carbon new homes in 2016 and tighter standards for refurbishments. This means a further 25% reduction in carbon emissions for all new homes and a 44% reduction for social housing. In addition, the Code for Sustainable Homes is under review and SAP is changing - so this is your chance to find out how to achieve these tough new standards.

TGR has added new dates to this series to include:

1. Parts F, J & L - Brighton 5 October

2. Part G - Brighton 8 December

What to expect:

- Up to date, concise guidance on the revisions to Parts F, J & L add Part G of the Building Regulations.
